UPDATES

Assessments Conducted for Special Education

The District is conducting assessments for special education in two ways: (a) through a virtual Distance Learning environment, and (b) through in-person appointments at District locations.

The District will continue to conduct assessments in a virtual Distance Learning environment in situations where the assessment that can be provided without in-person interaction, while maintaining the validity and reliability of the test.

The District will conduct assessments through scheduled in-person appointments at District locations in situations where the assessment needs to be conducted in person to maintain the validity and reliability of the test. In-person assessments will be conducted according to the highest level of health practices, including testing of all students and staff who are involved for COVID-19 in advance of a scheduled appointment for assessment.

Provision of Related Services Indicated on an Individualized Education Program (IEP)

The District is providing related services in two ways: (a) through a virtual Distance Learning environment, and (b) through in-person appointments at District locations. The District's determination of in which manner the related service will be provided is predicated on student accessibility of service.

- The District will continue to provide related services in a virtual Distance Learning environment.
- The District will provide related services through scheduled in-person appointments in situations where it has been determined that the student cannot access the service in a virtual Distance Learning environment.
- In-person services will be conducted according to the highest level of health practices, including testing of all students and staff who are involved for COVID-19 in advance of a scheduled appointment for service

TRANSITION SERVICES

Many of our students with disabilities need additional supports in their transition from high school to achieve their postsecondary goals. The District Office of Transition Services supports the provision of Transition Services for students with disabilities beginning in the 8th grade in the areas of Education, Employment, and Independent Living. Transition teachers provide career and college awareness activities, instruction, support in self-advocacy skills, and interest/aptitude assessments and checklists. The District Office of Transition

Services contracts with the Department of Rehabilitation (DOR) through the Transition Partnership Program and We Can Work to provide DOR Student Services to students with disabilities in the following areas:

- Job Exploration Counseling
- Work Readiness and Training
- Work Based Learning Experiences
- Self-Advocacy Skills
- Post-Secondary Counseling
