



Enrollment on the LAUSD <u>enrollment portal</u> ends on November 29, 2024.







Using First/Then Strategies to Support Positive Behaviors in the

In October and November, the **Special Education Behavior Support Department**, in partnership with the Family Academy Special Education Region Ambassador, provided training to families in each region, including those in our Virtual Academies and Option Schools, on using First/Then strategies in the home setting. Additionally, the Community Advisory Committee (CAC) Parent Ambassadors shared information with families about the CAC's work within LAUSD.
