Available to Children Ages 18 and Younger

The Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) will be providing meals to children 18 and younger at our 63 Grab & Go Food Centers under USDA's Summer Food Service Program. These 63 Grab & Go Centers have been operating since March 18, 2020 and will continue to operate through August 14, 2020, Monday to Friday, between the hours of 8 – 11 a.m. Breakfast and lunch will be provided to every child. During the regular school year, 80 percent of Los Angeles Unified students qualify for either free or reduced-priced meals at school. LAUSD remains dedicated to our mission of helping students learn and supporting students and families in need.
