Request for Chemical Product Evaluation Date:

The District maintains a "Chemical Products List" specifying commercial products which have been reviewed and determined safe for use at District facilities. Chemical products may not be used in District facilities unless they are included in the approved list, which may be found at www.lausd-oehs.org. This form may be used to request OEHS review and approval of chemical products not presently on the Chemical Products List.

To request a chemical product evaluation:

- 1. Complete all sections of this form. A separate request form must be submitted for each product; you may not submit multiple products with one request form. If it is a multi-part system, then please note the specific products that must be used in the "Application Method" section.
- 2. Click on the "Submit by E-mail" button at the top of the form. This should open a ready-to-send e-mail with a data attachment using your desktop e-mail client. If you prefer to use web-based e-mail, you may send a saved copy of the completed PDF form as an e-mail attachment to chemeval@lausd-oehs.org
- 3. Attach an electronic copy of the MSDS and any other documents you are submitting for review to your e-mail.
- 4. Send e-mail.
- 5. Requestors will receive a reply e-mail when the product evaluation has been completed advising them of the approval status. The OEHS website will be updated within one week of the evaluation.
