## 6. Mitigation, Monitoring, and Reporting Program

State CEQA Guidelines, Section 15074(d), requires that a lead or responsible agency adopt a mitigation monitoring plan when approving or carrying out a project when an IS/MND identifies changes the lead agency has required in the project or made a condition of approval to mitigate or avoid significant environmental effects. As lead agency for the Project, LAUSD is responsible for adoption and implementation of the mitigation monitoring and reporting program (MMRP).

The MMRP is presented in Table 23 below and will be in place and effective throughout all phases of the Project. LAUSD will be responsible for administering the MMRP and ensuring that all parties comply with its provisions. LAUSD may delegate monitoring activities to staff, consultants, or contractors. LAUSD will also ensure that monitoring is documented through periodic reports and that deficiencies are promptly corrected. The designated environmental monitor will track and document compliance with required measures, note any problems that may result, and take appropriate action to rectify problems.
