POLICY:	This is a revised policy for the class of 2016 defining A-G validation and substitution rules, following California State University (CSU) guidelines		
MAJOR	This is a revised bulletin for the class of 2016, which aligns the graduation requirements		

CHANGES: into three distinct categories; California Department of Education (CDE), Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD), and the minimum (California State University) A-G requirements including validation and substitution rules.

GUIDELINES: I. BACKGROUND

On June 14, 2005, the Board of Education approved the Resolution to "Create Educational Equity in Los Angeles Through the Implementation of the A-G Course Sequence as Part of the High School Graduation Requirements." On May 8, 2012 the Board of Education passed the Resolution "Enhancing Instruction and Academic Achievement". Both of these resolutions established the criteria for all students to complete a college preparatory course sequence that includes a minimum of fifteen "a-g" courses. Enrollment in the "a-g" course sequence began in 2008.

For the class of 2016 and beyond, completion of the "a-g" course sequence is included in the graduation requirements. On May 14, 2013, the Board of Education approved the validation rules applicable to mathematics, language other than English (LOTE) and chemistry as set forth by California State University (CSU).

In addition to the "a-g" course sequence, students need to complete the CDE and LAUSD requirements. All courses must be completed with a grade of "D" or better.

II. GRADUATION ELIGIBILITY

To receive a high school diploma in LAUSD, students must meet:

- A. Minimum (CSU) "a-g" requirements
- B. CDE graduation requirements and
- C. LAUSD graduation requirements



The chart below lists the minimum (CSU) "a-g" subject requirements, CDE and additional LAUSD requirements for graduation eligibility. LAUSD will honor CSU validation and substitution rules.

LAUSD GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Please note that completion of the minimum LAUSD graduation requirements does not qualify students for admission to a University of California (UC) or California State University (CSU) campus. To be competitive for college and scholarships students are encouraged to complete "a-g" courses beyond the minimum fifteen with a grade of "C" or better. For admission, colleges consider other areas such as scores on SAT/ACT exams, Grade Point Average (GPA) and extra-curricular activities. For additional requirements students may visit the specific college website.

Pilot schools may have some flexibility to alter the LAUSD graduation requirements that exceed LAUSD requirements. For further guidance, refer to the Pilot School Manual.



A. Minimum (CSU) "a-g" Requirements and Validation/Substitution Rules:

1. Minimum (CSU) "a-g" requirements

"a" Subject - History/Social Science (2 years): NO VALIDATION

- Students need 2 years with a grade of "D" or better for all semesters:
- 1 year of US History OR 1 semester of US History and 1 semester of American Government AND
- 1 year of world history, cultures and geography from "a" or history/social science from "g" subject area. *Note: For the UC system, one year of world history, cultures and geography from the "a" subject area is required for admission.*
 - Students who use a History/Social Science course from the "g" category may use the course for admission to CSU, not UC.

"b" Subject - English (4 years): NO VALIDATION

Students must complete 4 years of required LAUSD English courses under subject area "b" with a grade of "D" or better for all semesters.

- Students must take the required LAUSD English course or equivalent (e.g. AP English Language in place of American Literature and Contemporary Composition) for the grade level in which they are enrolled.
- If a student receives a Fail in a required LAUSD English course and has passed CAHSEE or state equivalent, another "b" English class may be substituted to satisfy the graduation requirement.
- Literature and Language and Advanced ELD are categorized as English Language Development courses by UCOP. Although these courses are "b" approved, a maximum of two semesters may be used to satisfy the "b" requirement.

Note: UC requires that students pass non-ELD "b" approved English courses in the senior year.

• For LAUSD graduation purposes the "b" requirement must be satisfied with English courses.

Students must be enrolled in the grade level English courses listed or their equivalent

"c" Subject - Mathematics (3 years): VALIDATION

Students must be enrolled in math for 3 years.

- "c" approved math courses completed in middle school may be used to meet the "c" math graduation requirement.
- LAUSD policy requires student enrollment in math grades 9, 10, and 11. Validation rules will be honored to meet the math requirement for graduation (see section 2 below).

<u>"d" Subject - Laboratory Science: VALIDATION – Chemistry Only</u> (CSU)

 $\overline{2}$ years required with a grade of "D" or better for all semesters. At least one year of biological science and one year of physical science, one course from the "d" subject area and the other course from the "d" or "g" area is required.

- Students are encouraged to complete 2 years of laboratory science from the "d" subject area.
- If students complete a science course from the "g" category to fulfill their laboratory science requirement, it will only be accepted by CSU, not UC.
- UC and CSU recommend three years of Science to be competitive for admission to college.
 - Chemistry is the *only* course where validation rules may apply (CSU only). (see section 2 below)

Note: UC requires at least two of the three foundational subjects of biology, chemistry, and physics; both courses must be from category "d".

"e" Subject - Language Other than English (LOTE): VALIDATION

2 years of language other than English (must be the same language,



American Sign Language accepted) with a grade of "D" or better

- Students who have met this requirement should be encouraged to take additional years of a language other than English to be competitive for admission to a university.
- Attachment E identifies options for students to demonstrate proficiency in a language other than English to meet the "e" requirement.
- Validation rules will be honored to meet LOTE requirement for graduation. (see section 2 below)
- "a-g" LOTE courses completed in middle school may be used to meet the "a-g" LOTE graduation requirement.
- The LOTE level may be found on the school's "a-g" approved course list on the UC Doorways website

"f" Subject - Visual and Performing Arts: NO VALIDATION

1 year required with a grade of "D" or better

• Students must complete one yearlong course in visual and performing arts selected from dance, music, theatre/drama and visual arts. Both semesters must be from the same course and taken in sequential order

"g" Subject - College Prep Elective

1 year required with a grade of "D" or better both semesters.

- Students may satisfy this requirement by completing two semesters from the list of "g" approved courses.
- If a student completes a course from the "a-f" subject areas beyond the minimum requirements, this course may be used to satisfy the "g" requirement.
- No introductory level courses in subject areas "c", "e" and "f" may be used to meet the "g" requirement.
- If all history/social sciences courses are passed, Principles of American Democracy and Economics can meet the "g" requirement
- If the student completes an advanced level mathematics course or Language Other Than English (LOTE) course, validation rules will apply.

2. Satisfying the "a-g" requirements through validation, substitution and examination

A. Validation Rules

In accordance with CSU admissions requirements, LAUSD has incorporated validation rules. Validation occurs when a student has successfully completed advanced work (earning a grade of C or better) in an area of sequential knowledge. In this instance, the student is presumed to have achieved proficiency in the lower-level coursework (e.g., Spanish 2, successfully completed, validates Spanish I).



Validation Rules apply to mathematics, LOTE and chemistry as follows:

Mathematics Courses

- A grade of C or better in the second semester of a yearlong Algebra course validates a Fail grade in the first semester. A grade of C or better in Algebra II validates Algebra I. A grade of C or better in Trigonometry or Math Analysis validates the entire math high school college preparatory requirement.
- A grade of C or better in Statistics will validate only Algebra I and II, not Geometry.

Note: For UC admission, a student must attempt both semesters of geometry to use an advanced level (Subject "c") Mathematics course to validate the entire mathematics requirement.

Languages Other Than English (LOTE) Courses (See Attachment C)

• A grade of C or better in a higher-level course validates a lowerlevel course. A higher-level LOTE course can validate the appropriate number of years based on the level. A college course can validate a high school LOTE course. The level of validation depends on the college course prerequisite and description. Refer to the UC Doorways website to determine the LOTE level.

Chemistry Courses:

• A grade of C or better in the second semester will validate a Fail grade in the first semester.

Note: Validation of Chemistry is only accepted by the CSU, and it will not be accepted by the UC. Also, if a student receives a grade of Fail, the validation rule may not be used to meet the CDE requirement. Refer to Section B for more information.

B. Substitution Rules

Students may substitute LAUSD required courses in the areas of "a" Social Science and "b" English. Refer to subject areas "a" and "b" for guidance.

C. Completion of "a-g" requirement by examination AP and SAT Subject test scores may be used to meet LAUSD "a-g" requirements. Refer to the CSU minimum scores listed on attachment B.

Note: Exams and Subject tests do not meet the CDE requirements and will not yield LAUSD credits, except for in the area of Language Other than English.

B. CDE Requirements



Students must complete the following CDE course requirements with a grade of "D" or better:

- Complete 2 years of physical education
- Complete the following courses or their equivalent:
 - a. WHG: MOD WLD AB
 - b. US HIST 20TH AB
 - c. PRIN AM DEMOCR
 - d. ECONOMICS
- Complete two years of sciences 1 year biological, 1 year physical
- Complete Algebra 1 between grades 6 12
- Complete two years of mathematics in high school
- Pass the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE) *except* for students with disabilities who meet the CDE exemption requirements. See REF-5452.0

Note: In some cases completion of an "a-g" course will also satisfy the CDE requirement. AP Exams and/or Subject tests may not be used to meet the CDE requirements, except for in the area of Language Other than English.

C. LAUSD Requirements

Students must also complete the following LAUSD requirements:

- 210 Course Credits
- Health Requirement (5 credits) The health requirement must be met by passing a five-credit health course that may be taken at any time during Grades 9-12. Options to fulfill health:
 - o Take Health, if offered, in summer school
 - Take an equivalent and pre-approved adult or college class. Note: Pilot schools have other options to meet the health requirement. (Refer to the Pilot School Manual for more details regarding the health requirement).
- Identify Career Pathway REF-911.1
- Complete a Service Learning project REF-3605

Note: AP Exams and/or Subject/Proficiency Tests do not yield LAUSD credits except for in the area of Language Other than English.

III. NUMBER OF COURSES REQUIRED EACH SEMESTER

All students must be enrolled in a full schedule each semester of high school to maximize student learning opportunities. Students must be enrolled in all periods that the school offers regardless of bell schedule.

The only exceptions to the above are:



- A 12th-grade pupil in his or her last semester or quarter before graduation, who is enrolled in a work experience education program and who will complete all of the requirements for graduation, may attend high school for a minimum of 180 minutes per day, upon the written request of a parent or legal guardian or upon his or her own request if the pupil is 18 years of age or over. (California Education Code 46147). LAUSD policy requires a minimum of 240 minutes per day. Student employment alone does not constitute enrollment in a work experience program.
- An 11th or 12th grade student who is enrolled part time in college classes, for which academic credit will be provided, may attend high school for a minimum of 180 minutes (California Education Code 46146). LAUSD policy requires a minimum of 240 minutes per day.

Parent permission is required for any student who meets the exemptions listed above and is placed on a shortened schedule. See Attachment E for Parent Authorization Form. Schools are responsible for collecting documentation that students are enrolled in college or a work experience program.

IV. CREDITS FOR SCHOOL SERVICE

School Service is a course reserved for seniors in high school who are on-track to graduate and meet all of the criteria outlined in REF-5886.0. Any student in grades 9 - 11 should not be enrolled in a service class.

V. CREDITS NEEDED TO PROMOTE FROM ONE GRADE LEVEL TO THE NEXT

Students will need to earn the credits listed below in order to promote to the next grade level:

10th grade	50 credits
11th grade	105 credits
12th grade	160 credits
Eligible for a high school diploma	210 credits

VI. YEAR OF THE DIPLOMA

Students must meet the graduation requirements of the school year listed on the diploma. Refer to REF-1963.0, "Graduation Year Guidelines to Determine Requirements for the Diploma" and for SIS Records for additional information. If a student completes the graduation requirements at the end of summer school/ intersession or at the end of the fall semester following the graduation year (identified in SIS/ISIS), he/she will receive the diploma with the previous June graduation date and be held to the graduation requirements of that school year. Students with disabilities and English Learners may extend their year of graduation according to District policy as referenced in the Special Education Policy and Procedures Manual and in the Master Plan for English Learners.

VII. PHYSICAL EDUCATION COURSE REQUIREMENT

Students are required to complete 20 credits of physical education for graduation. Students in grade 9 are to be enrolled in Physical Education Course ADV PE

1AB*. All 9th grade students are expected to participate in the state mandated physical fitness test (Fitnessgram®).

If a student does not pass the Fitnessgram ® in 9th grade, the student must

- be enrolled in Physical Education Course ADV PE 2AB* in the 10th grade and re-take the Fitnessgram® in 10th grade
- if the student does not pass the Fitnessgram® in 10th grade, the student must be enrolled in a PE elective (this can be an on-line course) until the student passes the Fitnessgram®

If the student passes the Fitnessgram®

- Student may request an exemption from completing a third and fourth year of P.E. (REF 6082.0 Student Physical Education Exemption Letter)
- Students must take a second year of PE (ADV PE 2AB*) but it may be taken anytime during Grades 10 – 12, to fulfill the CDE physical education requirement for graduation For specific information on physical education courses that meet this graduation requirements refer to BUL-2528.1 Physical Education Programs Grades K-12

*Students enrolled in an authorized California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) sanctioned interscholastic athletic sport that takes place during the school day are exempted while the sport is in season.

VIII. STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Students with disabilities working toward a diploma are required to meet the same graduation standards as their non-disabled peers. To ensure that each student is able to successfully access the curriculum, the IEP team will develop accommodations or modifications needed, which will be written in the IEP. Pending legislation from the state will determine the requirement for the designated high school exam. For state approved waivers for students with disabilities please reference REF 5982.0 *Algebra 1 Waiver Procedures for Students with Disabilities*, REF 4603.0 *Development of the Final Individualized Education Program (IEP) for Students with Disabilities expected to meet requirements for a Diploma.*

IX. STUDENTS IN FOSTER CARE

On October 11, 2009, AB 167 was passed and approved by the Governor to amend Section 51225.3 of the Education Code, relating to high school graduation for students in foster care. Among the provisions are:

- A pupil in foster care who is in grade 11 or 12 transfers between schools may be exempt from coursework and other requirements adopted by the district that are in addition to the statewide requirements, unless the district makes a finding that the pupil is reasonably able to complete the additional requirements in time to graduate from high school.
- Students must be notified of any requirements that may be waived and that may affect their ability to gain admission to a post-secondary institution.



- The school shall provide information about transfer opportunities available through the California Community Colleges.
- Senate Bill 1135 further clarified AB 167, stating that students must be evaluated within 30 days of their transfer

The minimum graduation requirements for eligible students in foster care as required by the CDE are the following number of courses in the subjects specified, each course having a duration of one year, unless otherwise specified:

- (A) Three courses in English.
- (B) Two courses in mathematics.
- (C) Two courses in science, including biological and physical sciences.
- (D) Three courses in social studies, including United States history and geography; world history, culture, and geography; a one-semester course in American government and civics; and a one-semester course in economics.
- (E) One course in visual or performing arts or foreign language.
- (F) Two courses in physical education, unless the pupil has been exempted pursuant to the provisions of this code.

Students in foster care must pass the CAHSEE or the designated high school exam required by California *except* for students with disabilities who meet the CDE exemption requirements.

If the Principal, or designee, and the Counselor determine that a student in foster care has met the requirements listed in AB 167 and will graduate and receive a diploma meeting the state's requirements, annotate the cumulative record to reflect this and include a note in SIS/ISIS. Refer to REF-5679.0 "Procedure for Notifying Students in Foster Care of the Exemption to Graduation Requirements (AB 167)". The APSCS or designee will write in the notes section of the paper cum "Student in Foster Care has met the state requirements for graduation for the year _____."



REOUEST FOR LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH (LOTE) CREDIT BY DEMONSTRATING PROFICIENCY THROUGH EXAMINATION

Students are expected to complete a minimum of 2 years of LOTE courses to meet the "E" requirement. Students who receive a mark of Fail in a LOTE course required for graduation must repeat that course, unless the course is validated with a grade of C in a higher level course or through examination.

Students demonstrating proficiency by one of the methods listed below will earn 10 credits by examination and 10 credits for earning Certification of Proficiency which will meet the two year "E" LOTE requirement. Students are encouraged to pursue additional years of study in a Language Other than English.

Students may demonstrate proficiency and meet the world language requirement through one of the following exams:

- ☐ If the student is **not enrolled in the AP foreign language course**, he/she may earn a score of 3, 4, or 5 on an AP foreign language exam taken in Grades 9, 10, or 11. Student will earn 10 credits for AP Language and will receive a Certification of Proficiency with 10 credits to meet the LOTE requirement. A mark of "P" is awarded.
- ☐ Take and pass both sections of the LAUSD Spanish Equivalency Examination. Go to <u>http://www.lausd.net/ociss</u> (click on World Languages and Cultures) for the latest bulletin and other relevant information. Students will earn 10 credits for the Spanish Equivalency Examination and 10 credits for demonstrating proficiency and will meet the LOTE requirement.
- □ Take and pass a foreign language proficiency exam at UCLA or another college. Student will earn 10 credits for the language and, if certified at level 2 or above, will receive a Certification of Proficiency with 10 credits and meet the LOTE requirement. A mark of "P" is awarded.
- ☐ Take an SAT Foreign Language Subject Exam or SAT Foreign Language Listening Exam in grades 10, 11, or 12 and earn the appropriate score (see attachment B). Student will receive 10 credits for the language course at level 2 and receive Certification of Proficiency with 10 credits and meet the LOTE requirement. A mark of "P" is awarded.
