Truman and MacArthur (11.9.3)

Background:

After early successes in Korea led by General Douglas MacArthur, UN forces were thrown back deep into South Korea when China entered the war. General MacArthur called for a widening of the war into China and for the use of atomic weapons. President Truman refused and an ensuing public argument between the two began. In April 1951 Truman relieved MacArthur of his command for insubordination.
