Go For Broke National Education Center's Defining Courage Exhibition welcomes school groups to explore contemporary issues of civil rights and equality. The issues are examined through the lens of the Japanese American World War II soldier experience. These young soldiers served their country at a time when the United States denied their civil rights.

Students will learn the stories of World War II Japanese American veterans and, through the interactive exhibition, they are asked to think critically about civil rights and what courage means in their own lives.
