# Scopes Trial (11.3.2)

#### Background:

In the 1920's conflict between Americans who wanted to return to "simpler" times and those who wanted to embrace what the future had to offer grew more and more tense. These tensions mirrored the growing differences between rural and urban parts of the nation. The nation became fixated on this when a biology teacher in Tennessee violated the state's law against teaching Darwin's theory of evolution and was subsequently arrested and put on trial. The trial, known as the Scopes Trial (or Monkey Trial) became a nation obsession.
