

American Indian Parent Committee Vacancy Election Guidelines

- 1. To participate and vote in the election process, candidates must have a child with a verified 506 form.
- 2. All newly elected members will be seated provisionally pending verification.
- 3. Candidates can self-nominate, or nomination can be made by other candidates within their category.
- 4. Guests may observe but are not allowed to talk during the process.
- 5. If a candidate leaves the zoom meeting for any reason, once the voting has ended, no more votes will be added.
- 6. Nominees must be present via zoom or telephone to be nominated and/or elected; no voting by proxy.
- 7. All voting will be conducted by a roll call vote.
- 8. All votes will be recorded in view of the participants. Each candidate will be asked to vote for a nominee within their category.
- 9. All devices must be turned to mute/silent mode during the election unless called upon. Texting participants or writing in the "chat" are not permitted.
- 10. All candidates must be attentive to the person facilitating the election (electioneer). No sidebar conversations. Please keep microphones muted.
- 11. No campaigning or soliciting of votes will be allowed.
- 12. If a candidate chooses not to vote for a candidate(s), they will simply say, abstain.
- 13. Each candidate will have up to 1 min to speak. Please adhere to the time limit.
- 14. Any irregularities during the process may result in the participant being disqualified from voting.
- 15. The candidate with the highest votes will become the representative that will serve for the designated term. The candidate with the second highest votes will become the alternate (when applicable).
- 16. In case of a tie, a runoff will be held among the candidates with the same number of the highest votes.
