Once released, it will be available on the <a href="#">California Dashboard</a>.</p>
<p>What legislative measures are being supported by the LAUSD SELPA?</p>	<p>The LAUSD Single Education Local Plan Area (SELPA) is currently supporting The Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA) Full Funding Act.</p>

<p>Is the projected state special education revenue generated from ADA (average daily attendance)?</p>	<p>Yes, the Assembly Bill (AB) AB602 funding formula is based on the <a href="#">Americans with Disabilities Act</a> (ADA) of all K-12 students in each SELPA, including non-SPED students.</p>
<p>Where does the local revenue come from? Are the final funds received shared publicly?</p>	<p>The local contribution portion stated in the Section D: Annual Budget Plan is LAUSD's general fund contribution for mandated special education programs for which the cost exceeds the state and federal funding provided. The district contributes approximately \$1.3b of Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) revenues to special education. The details of the operating Special Education budget for the District are shared publicly. They are reflected in the open data dashboard under Finance, Special Education (<a href="#">LAUSD Open Data Dashboard</a>)</p>
<p>What percentage of the SELPA annual budget goes towards educational programs for students? Percentage toward trainings for educators and families?</p>	<p>97% of the Special Education budget goes to supporting students with disabilities. This information can also be found in the Special Education Budget presentation at: <a href="#">Microsoft Word - 11-01-23SpEdAgenda.doc</a> (lausd.org). Our financial systems do not track expenditures specifically for trainings for educators and families.</p>
<p>Are there specific professional developments for school site staff or to any school interested? General Education teachers are interested to receive training on how to help support students with IEPs in mainstreaming classes.</p>	<p>The Los Angeles Unified School District offers various professional developments for general and special education teachers. The topics vary from evidence-based practices to writing strategies for all learners to understanding disabilities and accommodations. Further topics aim to include the following areas of focus: Including students with extensive support needs in general education classrooms, how to utilize assistive technology to support diverse learners, creating a sense of belonging, and understanding accommodations and disabilities. Additionally, the Inclusion Toolkit on LAUSD Schoology contains professional developments (PDs) on various topics with facilitator guides that any school can use.</p>
<p>What is section C of the Local Plan?</p>	<p>The California Department of Education (CDE) has not released the template for Section C. It was entirely removed from the 2024/2025 Local Plan template. There is no update from the CDE as to when this section will be released. Section C would otherwise include the Annual Assurances Support Plan. No further information is available at this time.</p>
<p>For Ambassador in-person workshops, are people welcomed to attend other regions meeting?</p>	<p>Yes, any family member/legal guardian can attend any of the Region Ambassador Parent Workshops. We encourage families to attend as many times as they need.</p>
