"What happens, to borrow the words of Adrienne Rich, when someone with the authority of a teacher describes our society, and you are not in it? Such an experience can be disorienting—a moment of psychic disequilibrium, as if you looked into a mirror and saw nothing." (Takaki, 1993, p. 16)

TUSD Context

- Department (1997), classes (2002)
- Year-long courses (5 HS)
- Offered in Junior and Senior years
- Southwest US
- High academic standards
- Core credit requirements



Results from TUSD



- MAS => Significantly...
 - More likely to pass AIMS
 - Writing
 - **Reading**
 - **Even Math?**
 - Graduate
 - More classes=Greater likelihood

Context of SFUSD

- 2007 curriculum developed
- Piloted, 2007-2008
- Scaled up, 2010-2013 (5HS)
- Students identified: 8th grade GPA<2.0 or <87.5% attendance
- Random assignment



Results from SFUSD



- Attendance: +21
 percentage points
- GPA: +1.4 grade points
- Credits earned: +23
 credits

 - More than electives
