The Los Angeles School Police Department is the nation's-largest independent force, with more than 400 officers. They are dedicated to serving L.A. Unified and respond to nearly 135,000 service calls a year.

I am grateful for the opportunity to join my colleagues in honoring our school police for their contributions to our schools and communities."

From patrolling campuses to working with numerous local law enforcement organizations, school police demonstrate heroic efforts every day by doing everything possible to ensure student safety.

Board Vice President Dr. George J. McKenna III, a co-sponsor said, "I salute the members of the school police, and the critical role they play, as first responders and partners in supporting teaching and learning in our schools."

The school police department began modestly. A security section was created within the District in 1948, after two night watchmen lost their lives. In 1983, a fully-certified police department evolved from the security section because local law enforcement agencies did not have the resources to handle the vast needs of the District for student, staff and school community safety.
