

Services offered by Pupil Services and Attendace

MISSION

To ensure that all LAUSD students are enrolled, attending, engaged, and on-track to graduate.

PURPOSE

Pupil Services & Attendance (PSA) Counselors are child welfare and attendance advocates who utilize a three– tiered model (prevention, early intervention, and intensive intervention) to improve individual and system–wide student attendance, engagement, achievement, and graduation.

FAMILYSOURCE PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

The FamilySource Partnership Program (FSPP) is a collaborative effort between the Los Angeles Unified School District and the City of Los Angeles Housing and Community Investment Department to service students and families in FamilySource Centers in lowincome communities. The partnership's systems and collectively aligned approach provides services through a multiagency collaboration academic to promote achievement and graduation for all students, help family systems thrive and strengthen communities.

FamilySource PSA Counselors are co- located at 19 FamilySource Centers (FSC) throughout the City of Los Angeles that primarily service families with children ages 5–17.

DIRECT SERVICES

- Conduct educational assessments

Pupil Services & Attendance (PSA) Counselors

Serve as liaisons between the school and the home and community, working on behalf of students whose home, academic or community life presents barriers which impede educational success.

Conduct comprehensive academic assessments with families and link families to appropriate support services with the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD), FamilySource Centers, and other community programs.

Work directly with students who experience difficulty in achieving their academic potential due to social, emotional, educational, home and/or community barriers.

Are experts in interpreting laws and bulletins related to education, enrollment, attendance policies, and pupil records.

Hold a master's degree in Social Work, School Counseling or Marriage and Family Counseling and hold Pupil Personnel Services Credentials specializing in Child Welfare and Attendance.

Collaborate at the community partners to ensure students are linked to needed services and resources.

Develop and implement trainings for parents and staff.
