Pathways to Completing High School

HIGH SCHOOL COMPLETION OPTIONS

Students with disabilities have one of two options when they complete high school. They can earn either a:

- (1) Diploma; or
- (2) Certificate of Completion.

Diploma: In order to earn a <u>diploma</u>, a student must earn 230 credits in the required course of study. Students with disabilities must take the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE), but currently do not have to pass it to receive a diploma if they meet all other requirements.

Certificate of Completion: A student with an Individualized Education Program (IEP) has the opportunity to earn a Certificate of Completion upon finishing high school if they have completed 230 credits, met their IEP goals, or participated in the educational program with satisfactory attendance. Students who receive a certificate of completion are eligible to continue receiving special education services until the age of 22.

ALTERNATIVE PATHWAYS TO A DIPLOMA

WITHIN LAUSD:

AEWC (Alternative Education and Work Center)

AEWC is a dropout recovery program with 26 locations serving at-risk and out-of-school youth ages 16-18. Independent study provides the flexible scheduling students need to maintain employment while earning a high school diploma or its equivalent. www.adultinstruction.org / 213-241-3154.

Carlson Home/Hospital Instruction Program

This program is for students who need their educational needs met at home or in the hospital while they are recuperating from an injury or illness. <u>chipahs.lausd.net</u> / 818-509-8759.

CDS (Community Day Schools)

The CDS are an option for expelled and other high-risk students. Students attend for a mandatory six hours a day. Contact Secondary Options Programs at 213-241-3821.

Central High School

City of Angels School

An independent study school that offers students a full-time educational program through weekly appointments. Continuation schools

Continuation schools provide a small campus setting, low studentteacher ratio, individualized instruction, and extensive counseling to strengthen positive self-concepts. Some schools offer four hour per week evening classes. Contact Secondary Options Programs at 213-241-3821.

DACE (Division of Adult and Career Education)

DACE offers a competency-based adult high school diploma program for students 18 years and older. Students may earn a diploma, prepare for the GED, and obtain vocational training. Education 2020 (E2020)

ALTERNATIVE PATHWAYS TO A DIPLOMA OUTSIDE LAUSD:

Community Colleges are located throughout the city and offer a wide range of opportunities for students to earn GEDs, Associate of Arts degrees and skills certificates. A diploma is not needed to attend a community college. Programs are available for students with disabilities. Courses begin four times per year with day or evening classes.
