Hello Wilmington Community of Schools stakeholders. As a reminder I am David Kooper, Wilmington Community of Schools Administrator and it is my pleasure to supervise the community of Wilmington for the Los Angeles Unified School District.

Today, I want to highlight one of our many amazing schools in Wilmington. Dan M. Isaacs Avalon High School is a continuation high school with an important mission to help students who are behind credits to recover credits in a small school setting and graduate. The school has a blended learning environment, which means that students learn through a combination of direct instruction, online learning, and group projects. Students work at their own pace to complete assignments and complete classes. Their blended program allows for individual growth and development.

Isaacs Avalon HS has a high attendance rate and boasts many unique programs to keep students engaged in their learning. The school has partnerships with community programs, some of which include Sharefest, Heidi Duckler Dance, and Theatre of Hearts. These community partnerships provide the school with specialized electives in Dance, Yoga, Percussion, Creative Writing, and College Access. Each Friday, classes form "Restorative Circles" for their first period where students can discuss topics they bring up to promote personal mindfulness. Isaacs Avalon HS also has a vibrant small-group after school tutoring program which meets twice weekly after regular classes to further personalize instruction for students to move further ahead in their coursework. The school also has a partnership with Los Angeles Technical Trade Community College to promote the many trades offered at LATTC which include construction management, automotive, plumbing, welding, electrical, culinary arts, nursing, and graphic arts. Each fall the school takes a field trip to explore the programs at LATTC. Graduates of these trade programs are highly sought by the largest employers in the Los Angeles area, which include the Port of LA, Metro Rail, Marathon Refinery, and LAX airport.

This school celebrates student achievement for all students through Student of the Month, a large chart in the main office where each student's course completions are charted, and departmental awards. When an individual student completes all of their requirements, that student goes to the middle of the campus with a large brass "gong" and beats away as the principal announces over the intercom the student's impending graduation. When the "gong" is heard by the classes, all students and staff go outside and loudly clap and cheer their classmates, as they will soon be next to get this awesome sendoff.

COVID-19 Testing: Who Can Get Tested








The testing process is simple:

- 1. Make an appointment online.
- 2. A quick-check-in upon arrival at the site.
- 3. The test is free and the process takes less than 10 minutes, from start to finish.
- 4. Test results within 24-36 hours via text and email.
