SUBJECT: LAUSD CAHSEE RESULTS FOR THE 2011-12 SCHOOL YEAR

This informative provides information regarding the pass rates on the California High School Exit Examination (CAHSEE) for the 2011-12 school year. Statewide results will be released by the California Department of Education (CDE) on August 22, 2012.

All California public school students must pass the California High School Exit Examination (CAHSEE) in both English language arts and mathematics and meet state and district course requirements in order to receive a high school diploma. As of the 2009-10 school year, students with disabilities are exempted from meeting the CAHSEE requirement as a condition for graduation.

Students are required to take the CAHSEE for the first time in grade 10. Students with disabilities are still required to take the CAHSEE in grade 10 for purposes of fulfilling requirements of the federal No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) of 2001. Students who do not pass one or both parts of the CAHSEE in grade 10 have up to two opportunities in grade 11 and up to five opportunities in grade 12 to retake the part(s) of the exam not yet passed.

Previous reports presented CAHSEE results up to the March 2012 administration. This informative includes all test administrations for the 2011-12 school year up to the May 2012 administration.

CAHSEE Results for Grade 10 Students

In the 2011-12 school year, more than three-quarters (76%) of the 10th grade students passed the English language arts portion of the test, and 77% passed the Mathematics portion, the highest since the inception of the exam. However, students must pass both parts of the exam to meet graduation requirements.

In the 2011-12 school year, 67% of 10th graders passed both parts of the exam. **The pass rate for the 10th graders in 2011-12 is higher than all previous 10th grade classes.** The percentage of 10th graders who passed both parts of the exam on their first try increased by 23 percentage points, from 44% in 2003-04 to 67% in 2011-12.




Figure 1: 10th Grade CAHSEE Pass Rates

Pass Rates by Subgroup

In the past year, pass rates increased for all major subgroups, except for English learners and students with disabilities.

Female students had higher pass rates than male students. Latino students gained by two percentage points from the previous year while African American gained by three percentage points.

Over the past eight years, pass rates for Latino students increased by 27 percentage points, from 38% to 65%. Pass rates for African-American students increased by 22 percentage points, from 36% to 58%.

Pass rates decreased by one percentage point for English learners and gained by one percentage point for Reclassified English Learners. Over the past eight years, pass rates for English learners decreased by seven percentage points.

Pass rates for students with disabilities remained at 18% for the past two years. However, pass rates have increased by 11 percentage points over the past eight years.

Comparison to State and Urban Districts

Comparisons to state and other urban districts is possible by subject only (i.e., English language arts or Mathematics), not by passing both parts. In English language arts, LAUSD's pass rate of 76% was below the statewide average of 83%. LAUSD's pass rate exceeded Fresno and Oakland. Over the past eight years, LAUSD's 14 percentage point gains was the second highest among urban district, after Pasadena's gain of 18 percentage points.

In Mathematics, LAUSD's pass rate of 77% was higher than Fresno and Oakland and on par with Pomona. The statewide average was 84%. LAUSD's gain of 19 percentage points over the last eight years was higher than other urban districts and higher than the statewide gain of 10 percentage points.

Percentage of Students Passing Both Parts of CAHSEE for 11th and 12th Graders

Pass rates for 11th and 12th graders have increased from the previous year. As of May 2012, 80% of 11 graders passed both parts of the exam, up three percentage points from the previous year. Pass rates for 11th graders have inched upward for each major subgroup, and is the highest in the past four years.

Pass rates for 12th graders at the end of the school year are at an all- time high of 88%, compared to previous years. Pass rates increased for all major subgroups.
