How Adults Can Leave a Schoology Course or Group

If you would like to leave a course, the course administrator must remove you from the course. Go to the Members page and click on the gear icon next to the course admin's name to send them a message asking them to remove you from the course. If you would like to leave a group, click 'Leave this group' located at the end of the left menu in the group.

Deleting of Courses

Schoology is integrated with MiSiS and will automatically update courses as schedule changes are made in MiSiS. <u>Manually</u> <u>deleting courses should NOT be done under any circumstance</u>. Doing so will have a negative impact on students and teachers in the course being deleted. If you are a member of a course and wish to be removed from it, inform the course administrator and have them remove you from the courses Members page. Do not go to your course list and delete the course manually. Deleting a course, yourself, deletes the course for everyone else as well. Course Administrators can remove a member from a course with the following steps:

- 1. Go to the Members page
- 2. Click on the gear icon next to their name
- 3. Select Unenroll
