STUDENT CHARACTERISTICS

As of fall 2022, English and 97 languages are spoken in Los Angeles Unified schools. Los Angeles Unified has 86,081 students who are learning to speak English proficiently. The primary languages are Spanish (91% of English Learners), Armenian (1.67%), Russian, Korean, Arabic, Farsi, Vietnamese, K'iche' (a Mayan language of Guatemala), Bengali, Cantonese and other languages each accounting for less than 1% of the total.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Los Angeles Unified is the nation's second-largest school district.
- There are 331 magnet programs available for K-12 students. Themes include Career and Social Entrepreneurship, Center for Enriched Studies, Gifted and Highly Gifted, Liberal Arts, New Media, STEM and Visual and Performing Arts.
- Dual Language Education (DLE) programs are offered in Arabic, Armenian, French, Korean, Mandarin, Japanese and Spanish. In SY 2023-24, a total of 230 DLE programs will be offered across school communities. In addition to these languages in DLE, World Languages and Cultures (WLC) courses are also offered in American Sign Language, German, Hebrew, Italian, Latin, Filipino and Russian for a total of 13 languages. Los Angeles Unified's DLE programs and WLC courses strengthen the multilingual journey of students and families.
- Los Angeles Unified maintains 24 Wellness Centers, operated by district medical and mental health staff, Federally-Qualified Health Centers and/or County mental health providers, two School Enrollment Placement and Assessment (SEPA) Centers and 21 School-Based Health Centers, which are on-campus clinics that provide services directly to students and families.
